Happy New Year! I hope you all had a wonderful Winter break. I am really looking forward to this up coming term, our topics are as follows; Year 1/2 - Animal Planet, EYFS - Past and Present. #### Year 3/4

Welcome back to all the children, parents and families of Year 4, I hope you all had an enjoyable Christmas holidays, with lots of fun and memories made.

In Year 4 this term we are focusing on 'Crime and Punishment' and 'Plants of the World'.

In History we will be looking at how Crime and Punishment has changed through time.

We will be focusing on Local Significant Individuals which will include Edith Smith and Margaret Thatcher.

In Geography we will be looking at types of settlement, land use and economic activity.

In English we are working with different texts which include 'The Selfish Giant' and 'Cinamon'.

During our Maths lessons we will be focusing on Number and Place Value, Addition, Subtraction, Fractions, and Statistics.

We are working hard on our times tables, please remember to use our TTRS to help us with our times tables practise.

In RE we will be exploring Christianity focusing on the big question 'Why do we celebrate?'

Our unit of work this term in science is all about 'Habitats'. We will be habitat helpers and exploring and finding out about different habitats.

We are continuing to encourage and promote our love of reading, giving the children opportunities to read throughout the day and we will have our reading for pleasure session each day.

PE Days this term are Tuesday and Friday. We will be working on Swimming and Gymnastics.

Homework Day is on Tuesday and to be returned on a Monday.

#### Year 5/6

Welcome back to all the children, parents and families of Year 5 and 6, I hope you all had a wonderful time over the festive holiday and made lots of fun memories.

In Year 5/6 this term we are focusing on 'Sprites and Spirits' focusing on the Maya Civilisation, within our History lessons. In English we will be working on analytical essays and playscripts which will include Rain Player and The Tempest.

In Maths we will be focusing on 'Number and Place Value, Geometry, and Statistics. We will be focusing on our times tables this term, expanding our knowledge, and introducing new facts.

In Science we are working on 'Forces'.

In RE we will exploring Salvation in Christianity.

In Art, we will be learning all about the drawing technique of chiaroscuro and creating our own art.

PE days this term are Monday and Tuesday. We will be working on dance and swimming.
