SAT's Tests- Year 6 and Year 2- (POLITE REQUEST)

These take place in May 2020, please do not take any holiday time at this point of the year.

Please be advised, if your child has any **appointments** that she/he has to attend during the school day, the school will need to see an appointment card otherwise the absence with be unauthorised.

Schools Focus

Writing remains the school's main focus together with reading, spelling and maths.

Your support is very much appreciated. Providing students with homework creates opportunities for inactions among families. In addition to that, it helps students develop good study habits and cultivates a positive attitude towards school.

Parents can support their child's 'reading journey' through regular reading at home. Reading to and with your child every evening for at least ten minutes can make a dramatic difference to a child's achievement within school. A report from Oxford University Press highlighted the importance of parents reading with their children 'Children who read outside of class are 13 times more likely to read above the expected level for their age'.

The report also offered six tips for reading with your child at home, including:

- 1. Make time to read- even ten minutes a day
- Choose different types of books
- 3. Take turns to read
- 4. Talk about the book– asking your child questions
- 15. Pay attention to the language
- 6. Enjoy reading
